

Open Society Institute Assistance Foundation– Armenia

The invitation of Armenia to join the Council of Europe greatly influenced the political atmosphere in 2000. Some argued that membership would foster further development of the country's democratic institutions. Others claimed that candidate status and the political elite's desire for acceptance was more effective advantage for reform than membership. Under these circumstances, efforts to build domestic institutions to meet European standards are as necessary as ever.

To address this need, the Open Society Institute Assistance Foundation-Armenia pursued partnerships to promote democratic institutions throughout 2000. The Foundation was particularly active in the areas of grantmaking, media and journalism, legal education and services, ICT, and education.

In partnership with the Yerevan Press Club and Internews, Armenia, the Foundation implemented its strategy for journalism education upgrade, training of journalists, legislative drafting and harmonization of legislation in the area of media and communication with European standards and creation of electronic news exchange throughout Armenia.

In June, the first group of law students graduated from the Legal Clinic at the Yerevan State University. The Clinic offers a fully accredited curriculum and has made significant progress in institutionalizing new methods of legal training. The Clinic also facilitates access to justice by working closely with one of the Foundation's institutional partners, The Bar Association of Armenia, to provide free legal aid to poor and vulnerable groups. After only one year, this project has strengthened its legal expertise and long-term sustainability by gaining public recognition and support from donors and consulting firms.

Access to the Internet and technology was another priority in 2000. In cooperation with the USIS funded School Connectivity Project, the Internet and Education Programs continued to expand the Millennium Project. Through this project, the OSIAF-Armenia developed three E-courses for educators and supported training centers providing computer, Internet literacy, and advanced management of information systems training. Two international workshops, organized by the Foundation with support from the OSI-Budapest, addressed Internet development in Armenia and the introduction of information technology into the education system.

In 2000 the cultural events, publications and forums supported by the Foundation have resulted in several bright and memorable spots in cultural life of the country. The 'Private Look' film festival of independent documentary, contemporary music and art festival 'Perspectives of 21st Century', a book of Sergey Parajanov's letters, and master classes for young talented musicians were supported.

In 2000, the Step by Step Program in preschools and primary schools became independent and was the OSIAF-Armenia's institutional partner for both its Step by Step and Reading and Writing for Critical Thinking Programs.

The concept of partnership grants matured in 2000, when most of the Foundation's advanced programs were implemented through institutional partners. In many areas, partnership grants involving one or two carefully selected, long-term partners with a pre-negotiated strategy have proved to be more professional and yielded better results than traditional grants. Several partnership grants in the areas of law, media, and women's programs have attracted the support of local NGOs and international organizations gaining recognition and adding value to our initiatives.

The year 2000 became the first year when the Foundation operated in the new restructured capacity focusing on the areas where as we believe, we can initiate change and achieve sustainable impact. With the new board of directors, the crystallized structure and programs and supportive partners, we hope to become more efficient in support of open society development in Armenia.

The Civil Society Program aims to foster democratic reform in Armenia, cultivate liberal ideas by promoting the rule of law, human rights including rights of minorities and vulnerable groups, and furthering exercise of competent public power. In order to obtain the above-mentioned goals the program was developed in three directions: 1. Human Rights, 2. Education, 3. NGO Development. The Civil Society Program itself and through other program areas of the OSIAF-Armenia promotes a very important purpose; e.g. spreading the idea of tolerance in the society.

We supported ‘Arts and Culture Initiatives’ for special groups together with Arts and Culture Program. Within this initiative we supported projects for prisoners, gifted children of boarding schools, and hearing-impaired children.

A special attention was paid to an urgent problem of street children and those in conflict with law. We supported a project, which aimed to work with street children, to organize social rehabilitation of street children, help them to re-establish the family relations, to provide the children with opportunities to catch up with school and get moral and psychological support and access to medical treatment.

Although the Foundation does not have a separate program on Ethnic Minorities and while the country is dominantly mono-ethnic we still prioritize the issue of minority rights, particularly socio-economic and cultural rights. A comprehensive study on demographic, economic, cultural, educational status and needs of minority groups has been conducted and policy recommendations developed for state bodies and different donor agencies.

The Civic Education component employed two different approaches: awareness-raising and curricula development. The first is aimed to tackle moral values as well as to help to recover the spirit of the population, the trust in democratic principles by spreading the idea of justice among youngsters. To reach as wide an audience as possible we used the most accessible and influential means as arts and mass media.

The curricula development addresses the need of reforming educational system. Recently there have been a variety of programs and initiatives undertaken by both donors and government and aiming to change and to improve the school and university curricula.

To promote Civic Education, the Civil Society program closely cooperates with the Education and East-East programs of the Foundation. With the purpose to integrate the Civil Society and Education programs we supported curricula and teaching material for development and delivery of training courses ‘Philosophy for children: education for democracy’ in secondary and high school.

We shall further our initiatives that proved to be instrumental for ‘harmonization’ of the country’s membership in the Council of Europe, i.e. rights of national minorities, freedom of religion, gender discrimination and juvenile justice.

Law and Criminal Justice Program

The goals of this project are to help to establish rule of law to upgrade and modernize legal education, to provide information on current legal reforms and on free legal assistance and consulting services to the society and to vulnerable groups. The Law and Criminal Justice Programs closely collaborate with the Constitutional and Legal Policy Institute (COPLI).

In 2000 we continued to support the Legal Clinic established at Law Department of the Yerevan State University. The Clinic aimed to further the professional development of the faculty and to foster the process of capacity building at the department. Being a unique tool for law students in Armenia to acquire hands-on experience in law, it builds synergy with the other access to justice initiative of the OSIAF- Armenia, the free legal aid center for vulnerable groups of population. The Clinic has become a credited course.

With the emphasis on legal education, the curricula development at the YSU Law Department became a priority for the Program. Having started with the course "Freedom of Speech and Legal Regulation of Mass Media" we continue course development at the Department with the following items of International Law: "The Basis of Theory of International Law", "History of International Law", "International Law Advocacy Human Rights", "The Law on International Organizations", "Diplomatic and Consular Law", "International Court Procedures", "International Criminal Law", "International Agreements in Armenian Legal System", and "International Humanitarian Law".

The other major field of our interest was public awareness of new legal regulations and provision of legal consulting to a large sector of public. To make legal information and legal services accessible the center of the free legal aid started its work in the structure of the Bar Association of the Republic of Armenia (BARA), which closely cooperated with the Law Department of the YSU. For the period of year the Center served over 2000 people and represented more than 50 cases in court.

Within the Criminal Justice program we supported a project aimed to raise awareness of the rights of prisoners, to focus public interest on the problematic issues of imprisonment, to initiate a public debate on economic social and moral costs of imprisonment, the need to reduce the number of prisoners and make more use of alternative sentencing. In the course of the project such activities as public polls, filming the current situation in prisons, broadcast of the films, holding public discussions in mass media and in conferences in cooperation with the OSIAF - Armenia Media IPs. Within the framework of this program, specialists from Penitentiary Department of Ministry of Interior Affairs and of Justice were sent to number of trainings for penitentiary system specialists funded and organized by COLPI.

To build the institutional capacity of the partner organizations and to provide with professionals in developing areas of law more than 35 law students and young professors, courts from Court of Cassation, Court of Appeal, specialists from Ministry of Internal Affairs passed training at COLPI different training sessions in Budapest.

The Foundation will further focus its resources and efforts on legal education, penitentiary reform, anti-corruption activities and access to justice initiative.

The OSIAF - Armenia Women's Program consists of two parts: National and Network programs. The program aims to:

- ① raise social awareness on gender issues with specific focus on rural areas;
- ② introduce education on gender issues into Armenian educational system;
- ③ promote human rights and social education for women.

Since 1999 the OSIAF - Armenia National Women's program became an Institutional Partner (IP) grant program. "TRUST" Social Work NGO has become an IP for the National program. The IP worked on the promotion of gender socialization, creation of data base on gender issues and women's leadership development.

In the year 2000 the OSIAF - Armenia supported:

- ① Development of methodology for Gender Education for teenagers in high schools and colleges. The IP also provided training sessions for teenagers in high schools and mixed groups of students from different colleges using the developed methodology. The education process has been combined with surveys of teachers and teenagers, which gave better understanding of the level of social awareness on gender issues.
- ② Conducting surveys among women including two clusters -economically independent and socially active women and economically dependent and socially less active women. This survey of economically active women aimed to eliminate the issues of gender discrimination in labor and social life.
- ③ Preparation of Gender Education Methodology (Teacher's Manual) for publishing in both languages: Russian and Armenian.
- ④ Conducting Women Leadership Development training sessions. Participants of the sessions were selected according to the survey among socially active women. The first seminar session took place in March 2000. The participants of the seminar created the network and actively collaborated with "TRUST". Moreover, the members of the network participated in Duluth training seminar "Domestic Violence Against Women and Child Abuse" in Budapest, which was organized according to Network Women's Program (NWP).

The following activities have been also done in the scope of Network Program.

Under the umbrella of "TRUST" the Project on Domestic Violence Prevention, a follow-up activity of the Duluth training "Women-friendly response to violence Against Women" started.

Under the Gender Integration line the Evaluation and Documentation Project has been implemented.

The OSIAF -Armenia Women's Program Strategy will be based on the following priorities.

- ① To promote Gender Education.
- ② To conduct Women Leadership Development seminars.
- ③ To promote women's rights and to introduce the gender integrated approach to political, social, economic, and domestic spheres of Armenian society.

Mass Media Program

The goal of the Mass Media Program is to foster independent, objective and pluralistic media in Armenia through assistance to the establishment of a favorable and progressive legislative environment, professional development of journalists and media managers, their access to new communication technologies, and focused assistance to regional media.

The mass media program of the OSIAF - Armenia has become the first and largest program implemented through institutional partners (IP). In describing the undertaken activities and current status it is of direct relevance to focus also on the current structure of the program and the experience we have gained in identifying IPs and designing the IP grant projects. The Media Program has been split between two IPs, the Yerevan Press Club (YPC) and Internews - Armenia. The level of complexity and diversity of these two programs are different.

The YPC activities were grouped in three directions:

- ① Training of practicing journalists;
- ② Curricula and resource material translation and development for the master studies at Journalism Department of the Yerevan State University (YSU), YPC has also assisted in opening International Journalistic Facultative in the Yerevan Institute of Foreign Languages after Brusov;
- ③ Preparation of drafts and concept papers for media related legal regulation.

The project has assisted the YPC in evaluating the current legislation on MM and in making it complacent with international standards. The YPC had developed draft laws aimed at regulating activities of television, radio and press and had submitted that to NA discussion. Within the framework of the project much assistance has been provided to disseminate legal knowledge among young and experienced journalists.

To regularly implement changes in the sphere of journalist education and professional training of journalists YPC has provided assistance to the YSU Journalist Department: a new curriculum has been developed and introduced, new topical textbooks and educational materials have been purchased and translated, as well as the best professionals and experts have been invited to lecture on various topics.

Building on the previous years' achievement and capacity, the Internews -Armenia, the OSIAF -Armenia supported Internews - Armenia to develop a network for information distribution by means of modern technologies. To use the network in order to enhance access to information and diversify content of the regional media as well as disseminate local information throughout Armenia.

Up to date 30 regional stations have been connected and are actively engaged in exchange of news pieces and local information. This indeed is the only mechanism of horizontal news exchange between the regions. The training component of the project is also a substantial investment as it is basically the only quality high-tech and journalism training that is available for journalists in the regions. The training courses are delivered throughout the project to all stations and cover wide range of issues.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS

National Education Program

The goal of the National Education Program is to foster creation of new progressive and favorable education environment that would welcome, assist and serve the needs of learning society. One of the key components of National Education Program is development and implementation of community school model. It is deemed that this model can serve adult community life-long educational needs as well as to be utilized for establishment of regional Tele-Centers (TC).

In order to introduce and implement the concept of community schools in Armenia, twelve schools were chosen based on their commitment to the program, their geographical location, size and level.

To achieve the goal the National Education Program has worked in cooperation with other programs of the Foundation, particularly the Internet and East-East Programs. To utilize the best practices of other countries where the model works, we employed the East-East program both to educate local participants by sending them to conferences to Russia and for studying Community Education Management Course in Israel.

A very urgent issue of sustainability of community schooling was addressed together with the Internet Program of the Foundation. The Internet Program seeks to promote the lifelong education and community involvement through creation and support of regional Tele-Centers established in schools. Hence, within our Internet Program we supported a workshop where educators, information technology (IT) specialists, donors from Armenia and educators from Russia came together to share experience and to develop models for sustainable and advanced TCs.

With the full support of the OSIAF - Armenia the educational multimedia software on Geography (in Armenian and English) and Physics (in Armenian) have been created. The CDs are distributed among schools and the course on Geography will be available on Internet.

To promote Civic Education the Education program closely cooperates with the Civil Society and East-East programs of Foundation. Aiming to support regional cooperation and to promote Civic Education and tolerance the Foundation supported the Seminar on "How to Teach Controversial and Sensitive Issues in History in Present-day Secondary Schools" of General Secretary of Council of Europe.

Step by Step

In the year of 2000 "Step By Step" (SbS) has already established stable cooperation with the Ministry of Education, educational departments of marzes, municipalities, kindergartens, schools, teacher training institutions, and NGO community. In 2000 collaboration and concerted actions with "Save the Children" resulted in renovation of the kindergartens located in remote villages by "Save the Children" and introduction of child-centered methodology by "Step by Step." Other organizations - UMCOR, Fund for Armenian Relief, contributed food to SbS sites.

In autumn of 2000 five Preschool Training Centers were established to train and mentor 30 new SBS classrooms. Thirty-two first grade classrooms opened to meet the needs of SbS preschoolers who, by that time, had reached the primary school age. The Program continued in the second grades of the 1999 SbS schools, following the natural development of the Program.

A comprehensive approach to teacher and parent training on disability issues began in 2000. In February, a training was organized for preschool teachers and specialists representing different local and international organizations dealing with children with special needs and their families.

On the basis of Yerevan Kindergarten No.280 the program will seek to create a model site for providing ongoing trainings on disability issue.

At the higher education level, the annual training seminar was held for enhancement of the faculty involvement. The practice of taking pedagogical university and college students to SbS sites for practicum has already started. In 2000 fundraising was one of the focus areas in SbS activities.

Reading and Writing for Critical Thinking

The goal of the Reading and Writing for Critical Thinking Program (RWCT) is to promote democratization of teaching and learning process in general education by creating an open and efficient environment for students and help them think critically and independently. The program works with teams of schoolteachers, university faculty, and teacher trainers to share with them interactive methods of instruction, and to assist with adapting those methods to the local educational context.

Two RWCT trainings were held in 2000. In the fall of 2000, a 4-day workshop was conducted by the international volunteers for the original 35 participants to help them to plan workshops for the second generation of educators.

In October 2000 the SBS and RWCT programs of the OSIAF - Armenia span off, and a newly established NGO "SBS Benevolent Foundation" became an institutional partner of OSI for these two programs.

I*EARN Program

I*EARN program furthers a school network establishment and fills the network with its special content. Having got familiar to I*EARN children themselves will broad the frame of I*EARN topics and discussion groups. The Republican Children's Library after Khnko Aper has included the course of I*EARN introduction into its Internet tutorial and has enlarged the community of I*EARN. The Library being very popular place of children's community continues teaching newcomers of I*EARN environment thus founding the self-sustainability of the project in Armenia.

External Education Programs

In 2000 the OSIAF - Armenia External Education Programs incorporated the following basic directions of activities: 1) scholarships for students 2) short-term support schemes for university teachers and working experts and research support for grantees working in Armenia.

All programs promote development of social sciences and humanities in Armenia, thus fostering the establishment of open democratic society in Armenia. The programs provide Armenian citizens with opportunities of better access to information, exposure to the Western-type of educational system, as well as the possibilities of establishing ties with their colleagues from other countries for cooperation and exchange of experience.

Scholarship programs provided high quality educational services to the gifted students in various sciences, hence providing opportunities to them to continue academic career at Central European University (CEU), American University in Bulgaria (AUBG), Soros Supplementary Grants Program (SSGP), Global Supplementary Grants program (GSGP) and Human Rights Center-University of ESSEX.

Short-term support scheme programs, Curriculum Resource Center (CRC), Summer University (CEU SUN), were extremely supportive to Armenian educators in promoting the development of higher education in Armenia, as well as providing research opportunities for scientists.

In 2000 the OSIAF-Armenia further developed the External Education Programs by establishing contacts with local universities/institutes teaching humanities and social sciences, promoting the integration of the External Education programs' graduates into the Armenian society by involving them in teaching at local universities and community citizens in order to raise the impact of this programming area on the changes in the higher educational system of Armenia.

Internet Program

The OSIAF - Armenia Internet Program aims to:

-  create models, which will help to eliminate economic barriers for the entry of the on-line community;
-  create initial training capacity (human resources; training materials in Armenian);
-  promote development of the on-line content and Armenian language content development tools;
-  raise awareness of information society opportunities and threats, cultivating open society values.

The Internet Program has initiated so-called Mashtots Millennium Project, which will link all Armenian Schools by 2005. This implies diffusion of advanced information technologies into education process of Armenian society.

As a result of this project, total of 32 schools have been awarded small grants for equipment, training and connectivity. The OSIAF - Armenia provides training through the capacities previously sponsored training centers of ISOC which prepare network administrators for Win NT or LINUX based networks and Electronic Publishing Training Center which provide training for basic Internet usage, Web publishing and design. Workshops and conferences for schools network is another important part of the Telecenters development. In 2000 a seminar on creation of local Telecenter on basis of secondary schools took place. This workshop created information flow among all schools and organizations involved into schools connectivity projects.

In the area of content development the OSIAF - Armenia sponsored development of Search Engine for Armenian Language online content. The search engine will be ready for deployment on the second half of 2001.

In 2000 the OSIAF - Armenia supported establishment of regional CISCO academy in Armenia on the basis of SEUA. As a result of this grant, four trainers received training and certification for trainers in CISCO Network Academy. A regional CISCO academy will provide extensive training for IT professionals at all levels with the goal to design, build and maintain modern complicated computer networks

PUBLISHING PROGRAM

Print
Publishing

The goals of the Publishing Program are to promote development of intellectual freedom and eliminate barriers of isolation created during the Soviet era through the publication and dissemination of books which promote values of open society and new ways of thinking and which were not available during the past seven decades; enable publishers and printers to modernize their professional skills and acquire knowledge of new technologies, including in the sphere of electronic publishing, through participation in trainings (either in-country or abroad) and in relevant international forums (conferences, workshops, seminars); support projects aiming at content development in the sphere of electronic publishing, using and building on the existing infrastructure.

The OSIAF - Armenia through its Print Publishing Program participates in "Translation project" of the Center of Publishing Development (CPD). As a result CPD along with the OSIAF - Armenia Publishing program supported six Armenian publishing houses for translation into Armenian and publication of seven books from the CEU Press Translation List in 2000. These books include many valuable titles of both classical and modern authors, which are unfamiliar to Armenian readers. In 2000 the Translation Project was focused on contemporary subjects and new directions in Western humanities.

Library Program

The main focus of the Library program in 2000 was automation of libraries and creation of national bibliography. The National Library of Armenia has been selected as an Institutional Partner of the OSIAF - Armenia Library Program. In close cooperation with other libraries (Yerevan State University Library, Fundamental Library of National Academy of Sciences of Armenia, Scientific-Technical Library), as well as with National Book Chamber, the IP implements a project for creation of united automation library system called EBASA (Union Armenian Library Automated System). This project aims to create an automated library network in Armenia, having a multidimensional direction (creation of electronic library and bibliographic databases, informative resources in various fields and national bibliography, providing access of local and external users to the system, curricula and educational-methodic material development, conferences and trainings for the librarians). The first step in implementation of EBASA is establishment of the Library Consortium that will serve as a project board during the whole period of project implementation and will undertake particular tasks of the project as decided and approved by the Consortium and the OSI. The tasks include but are not limited to training of librarians, management of the EIFL Direct Project, development of the second stage proposal for project implementation.

EIFL direct

More than 13 libraries and institutions were subscribed to Electronic Information For Libraries Direct (EIFL Direct). This initiative is a result of a joint project between the Open Society Institute (OSI), a part of the Soros foundations network, and EBSCO Publishing (EBSCO), a leading provider of reference resources. EBSCO Publishing Databases Available to Members of EIFL Direct EBSCO Publishing will supply five databases to members of EIFL Direct. They contain full text from over 3,200 unique journals, magazines, newspapers and newswires, as well as over than 1,300 full text brochures and reference books. Information provided to EIFL Direct members consists of scholarly journals covering humanities, social sciences, education, business, and medicine. The databases accessed via the World Wide Web, CD-ROM or DVD-ROM depending upon the available technology of each institution.






Pushkin Mega project

The Library program of the OSIAF - Armenia participates in Pushkin mega-project, initiated by the OSI-Russia, which made possible to increase substantially the stocks of Russian-language literature of six Armenian libraries.



Arts and Culture Program

The main goals of the Arts and Culture Program are:


-  development of an independent sector, arts management and cultural policy.
-  increasing the volume and quality of available information and facilitation in creation of information society.
-  promotion of the cultural dialogue and networking among Armenia, countries of the former Soviet Union and eastern Europe.

The Arts and Culture Program supports projects that facilitate formation of a pluralistic and independent cultural life, development of new fields of cultural activity and modern cultural trends, promotion of innovative study methods and new technologies in arts and culture, establishment and spreading cultural information links and development of culture in provinces.

In 2000 the OSIAF - Armenia Arts and Culture Program announced two major competitions: 1) organization of arts activity among vulnerable groups of society, and 2) cooperation between museums and educational institutions. Five grants were awarded to local NGOs and other organizations within this competition. One-year arts classes and exhibition of works became available for mixed groups of disabled and not disabled children. Three regional museums and one of the central museums of Armenia acquired an opportunity to develop into the active operational centers via development of their capacity and operational modes. Issue of newspaper in collaboration with school-children, museum children's club, a booklet on historical monuments as well as workshops, excursions, and open-air lessons had to be carried out during the year.

Developing contemporary arts and information society is of the prime concern of the program. Thus initiations to realize a three-concert festival to perform new music works of Armenian and foreign composers presenting rich musical heritage from Kxenakis to Terteryan, creation of a contemporary art exhibitions' website and publication of a catalogue were granted in 2000 as well.

Pursuing its goal to be involved in international cultural processes, the OSIAF - Armenia actively participated in network Arts and Culture program competitions for developing regional networks, stimulating cross-border cooperation, raising professional level, disseminating cultural information, and pioneering new ideas. Two festivals of feature, documentary and independent films and of contemporary music and arts as well as the master-classes by Moscow and Croatian professors of piano, flute, clarinet and violin celebrated the contemporary music and arts in Yerevan in 2000.

Public Health Program

In 2000 the OSIAF - Armenia National Public Health Program focused on the Mental Disability Project to demonstrate alternative ways of addressing the issue. The OSIAF - Armenia's general approach to the Public Health program was to promote integration of mentally disabled people into society by raising public awareness of issues of the disabled, to create a model day care center to serve as a possible alternative to institutions, a community-based family counseling service for the parents of disabled children.

The goals of the program were to:

-  promote alternatives to mental institutions;
-  integrate the mentally disabled into the society;
-  start a community-based family counseling service for family members and mentally disabled people.

The program was implemented by two Institutional Partners the "Armenian Mental Health Foundation" and "Khnamk" NGOs, which created a network of services to support people with mental illness. Two different models, a community-based accommodation and a day-care center for people with mental illness were created, to serve the aims of the program.

The OSIAF - Armenia also supported initiatives of the OSI Network Public Health Program responding to the current needs of the country by disseminating information on competitions announced by the PH OSI-NY and by providing logistic and expert support whenever required. These are such programs as Geriatrics and Gerontology, Palliative Care, Health Care Initiatives and other competitions.

The OSIAF - Armenia participated in Professionalisation in Public Health program organized by the Association of Schools of Public Health of the European Region (ASPHER).

The OSIAF - Armenia Network program played a key role in providing professional development activities to medical/health professionals.

The Salzburg seminars, weeklong training courses had a purely clinical approach and were conducted in Salzburg, Austria by renowned professors from American medical institutes. The program was co-funded by the Austrian Government and provided training opportunities to a large group of physicians.

The Schweitzer program, administered by the Albert Schweitzer Institute, focused on health and ethics. ASI assisted the network to organize regional and subregional conferences on issues of prison health.

Both programs focused on innovation and exposure to new ideas.

East-East Program

The OSIAF - Armenia East-East Program is a cardinal interlacing instrument contributing to work of the OSI network and national programs, and to our Institutional Partners (IP) and other organizations in their endeavor to build civil society. The OSIAF - Armenia program promotes regional contacts among specialists in various fields of strategic and social importance in the process of transition. These are, for instance, integration of society, rule of law and development of civil society, public health, human rights and justice, democratic institutions, and educational system. This program helps people to establish new opportunities for information sharing and communication, inspiring them to have active participation in the social life changes of the community and country, helps individuals to master the feeling of being deprived of the chance to communicate with their foreign colleagues, supports projects that can provide alternative solutions and have practical and realistic results. Since, the problems of terrorism in media coverage and participation in civil processes are of common concern, countries from different geographical regions, North Ireland, Russia, Georgia, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, expressed their interest in participation in the project. Embassies, International organizations, NGOs, renowned journalists and media representatives participated in the conference. Trilingual book summarized the project and thesis of participants.

Participation of Armenian specialists in international seminars, internships and trainings.

The OSIAF - Armenia East-East Program finds important participation of local specialists in international projects for its instrumental role of involvement of Armenian specialists in international development processes. This input contributes to formation of professional networks and initiation of joint projects. The Program paid special attention to projects coinciding with the strategy goals of the Foundation. In particular, the East-East Program has had distinctive and considerable contribution to the Civil Society, Law and Educational Programs.
